What We Do

Our institution is the only one in the region that welcomes every child regardless of background, behavior, academic ability, or economic standing. We turn no child away.

- After-School Programs with hot meals, homework help & life skills
- Therapeutic & Emotional Support by trained professionals
- Transportation, Clothing, Holiday Meals so no child goes without
- Kimcha D'Pischa Food Distributions to families in need

The Crisis We Are Facing

In recent years, our enrollment has dropped from 240 to just 50 children.

Not because the need is gone—because the resources have. Due to war, cuts in government support, and a collapsing economy in Safed, we are now on the brink of closure.

\$753,000 – Annual operating budget

\$247,000 - Current shortfall

\$767,000 – Total accumulated deficit

Staff unpaid for months. Children turned away. Programs shuttered.
